



Assets that refuse unauthorized actions

Freight Doesn't Fail Digitally. It Fails Physically.

- Software can decide.
- Paper can instruct.
- Only assets can refuse.

Admiral Enforce is hardware that makes trust real.

It embeds authorization directly into trailers and containers — so access is decided, enforced, and logged automatically.

- No supervision.
- No judgment calls.
- No “we’ll sort it out later.”

Authorization during execution

Admiral Enforce applies authorization during the load, at the moment actions occur — not at contracting time and not after the fact.

Because authorization is enforced at the asset itself, Enforce does **not** require the shipper to own the trailer.

Authorization travels with the load.

Admiral-equipped assets decide:

- ▶ **Who is allowed to access the load**
- ▶ **Where access is permitted**
- ▶ **When access is valid**

If authorization is valid, access works. If it isn't, nothing happens. Doors remain locked. Brakes remain engaged.

When enforcement is guaranteed

- ▶ **Strategic and straight theft disappear**
 - Drop & hook: the trailer will not release unless the correct tractor and authorized driver are present.
 - Straight theft: unauthorized movement is refused — the trailer does not leave.
 - Live load: unauthorized departure is always prevented; unauthorized loading is prevented when dock workflows bind access to the load.

When dock and execution workflows are used, authorization is bound to the load itself — eliminating fictitious pickups and errors.

▶ Seals become optional

Door access is enforced against opening authority, which can be assigned to the shipper or consignee.

When the shipper does not own the trailer

Shippers may require that a load be executed on an Admiral Enforce-equipped trailer, similar to how insurance limits or equipment capabilities are specified.

This ensures that access and movement authorization is enforced physically during the load, regardless of who owns the equipment.

▶ Yard supervision scales down

Routine custody no longer relies on guards, badges, or seals. Authorization is verified against documented rules, enabling safe unattended operations with human oversight focused on exceptions.

▶ Disputes become factual.

Disputes are resolved against verifiable execution facts rather than testimony or paperwork.

Admiral Enforce is part of a system

▶ Admiral Resolve

decides what should happen.

▶ Admiral Enforce

makes sure it does happen. Enforce is the point where digital authorization becomes a physical reality.

▶ Admiral Execute

builds workflows that scales operations.

If a seal matters to you, enforcement should too.
